Along with this letter, I would like to officially start to our Fair Boxing program to guarantee a sport free of drugs and performance enhancing substances.

For this matter, we are joining forces with the Voluntary Anti-Doping Association (VADA) to successfully protect the physical and psychological health of the boxers against the risks and side effects caused by the use of dangerous techniques and substances.

This is why all boxers in our rankings, and also those who wish to fight for a world title, will have to sign up in VADA and our Fair Boxing Program. At first, we are requesting them to do it voluntarily, until the end of this year, but by 2018, it will be mandatory. With this, any of them may be selected to randomly take the tests. The VADA offers effective anti-doping programs in which boxers are eligible to take blood or urine tests without notice, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, throughout the year.

For world title bouts, both boxers will be requested to take the tests before and after the fights.

Boxers who do not comply with the program, either because they do not agree to enroll, because they do not want to participate in the tests, or because their results are positive in any of the exams will have to face the sanctions established in the WBA By-Laws.

Thank you very much for your help and support in making Boxing a fairer and more transparent sport.
